

- **Privacy** — Prefer to block views into your property? Choose solid panels or closely spaced pickets rather than open-bar styles.
- **Curb Appeal & Style** — Want your gate to make a statement? Ornate traditional designs add elegance; sleek modern ones keep things clean and contemporary.
- **Everyday Access** — Pedestrian only (side/garden gate)? Or vehicles (driveway)? Driveway gates need wider openings and stronger builds.
- **Pet/Child Safety** — Need to keep animals or little ones contained? Look for no climb features and secure latches.




## STEP 2: PICK THE BEST METAL MATERIAL

The metal affects durability, looks, weight, and upkeep—especially in the UK's rain and wind.

- Steel (often galvanised or powder-coated)
- Pros: Extremely strong and durable; great for security; can handle heavy use; versatile for custom designs.
- Cons: Heavier (needs strong posts/hinges); can rust if not properly treated (galvanising + powder coating helps hugely).
- Best for: Driveways, high-security needs, or traditional looks. Popular in the UK for its toughness.
- Aluminium
- Pros: Lightweight (easier on hinges/motors if automated); naturally rust-resistant; low maintenance; modern finishes available.
- Cons: Not as strong as steel (better for lighter-duty use); can dent more easily.
- Best for: Coastal areas, modern homes, or where you want minimal upkeep.
- Wrought Iron (or wrought iron-style steel)
- Pros: Timeless, elegant with ornate scrolls/finials; very customisable.
- Cons: Heavier; needs regular maintenance to prevent rust unless protected.
- Best for: Period homes, decorative entrances, or that classic UK estate look.

Most UK residential gates use galvanised steel with powder coating for the best balance of strength and weather resistance.



# Step 3: Choose the Gate Type & Operation

How the gate opens matters for space and convenience.

- Swing Gates (single or double leaf)
- Classic and elegant; open like a door.
- Need space to swing (check driveway slope/width). Great for most homes.
- Sliding Gates
- Slide along a track; ideal for limited space or steep drives.
- More secure in wind; often automated.
- Manual vs Automatic
- Manual: Cheaper, simple.
- Automatic: Convenient (remote/keypad); adds security but needs power and occasional servicing.

# Step 4: Think About Design & Size

Match your home's style for the best result.

- Traditional/Ornate — Scrolls, finials, spear tops (e.g., styles like Clifton, Edinburgh, or Royale). Perfect for cottages, Victorian, or period homes.
- Modern/Contemporary — Clean lines, horizontal bars, minimalist (e.g., Verona, Monaco, or custom sleek designs). Suits new builds or updated properties.
- Estate/High-Security — Tall, solid, imposing for driveways.
- Size Tips — Measure your opening accurately (width + any posts). Driveways often need 3-5m+ for vehicles. Height: 1-1.5m for garden/pedestrian; taller (1.8m+) for security/privacy.



# Step 5: Key Practical Factors

- ✔ Maintenance — All metal gates are low-maintenance compared to wood. Powder-coated or galvanised ones need just occasional cleaning; check hinges/latches yearly.
- ✔ Weather Resistance — UK rain means rust protection is key—ask for hot-dip galvanising + powder coating.
- ✔ Budget — Basic steel starts affordable; custom ornate or automated adds cost. Factor in installation too.
- ✔ Installation — Professional fitting ensures it lasts (posts set in concrete, level, secure).
- ✔ Extras — Automation, intercoms, locks, or paint colours to match your home.
